## **DESCRIPTION**

The aim of this module is to outline the knowledge, skills and competences needed to apply the EUAA's structured method of evidence assessment when assessing an application for international protection so that the risk of subjectivity in individual cases is reduced.

Learners will be provided with the knowledge and skills necessary in order to apply the EUAA structured method of Evidence Assessment when assessing an application for international protection. The EUAA evidence assessment methodology builds around three different and distinct steps: gathering information, credibility assessment, risk assessment.
