Daily expenses allowance	<p><b>42.</b> Ensure that an adequate daily expenses allowance is provided.</p>	<p><b>42.1</b> A clear definition of the scope of daily expenses allowance exists.</p> <p><b>42.2</b> The method for the calculation of the daily expenses allowance is clearly determined.</p> <p><b>42.3</b> The daily expenses allowance is provided at free disposal (“pocket money”).</p> <p><b>42.4</b> The amount of daily expenses allowance also reflects as a minimum the following expenses, unless ensured in kind: communication and information, school items, personal hygiene and body care, leisure activities and travelling costs as a result of healthcare visits and obtaining medication, the asylum procedure and legal assistance, and education for children enrolled in school or other education arrangements.</p> <p><b>42.5</b> The daily expenses allowance is provided regularly and no less than once a month.</p>
