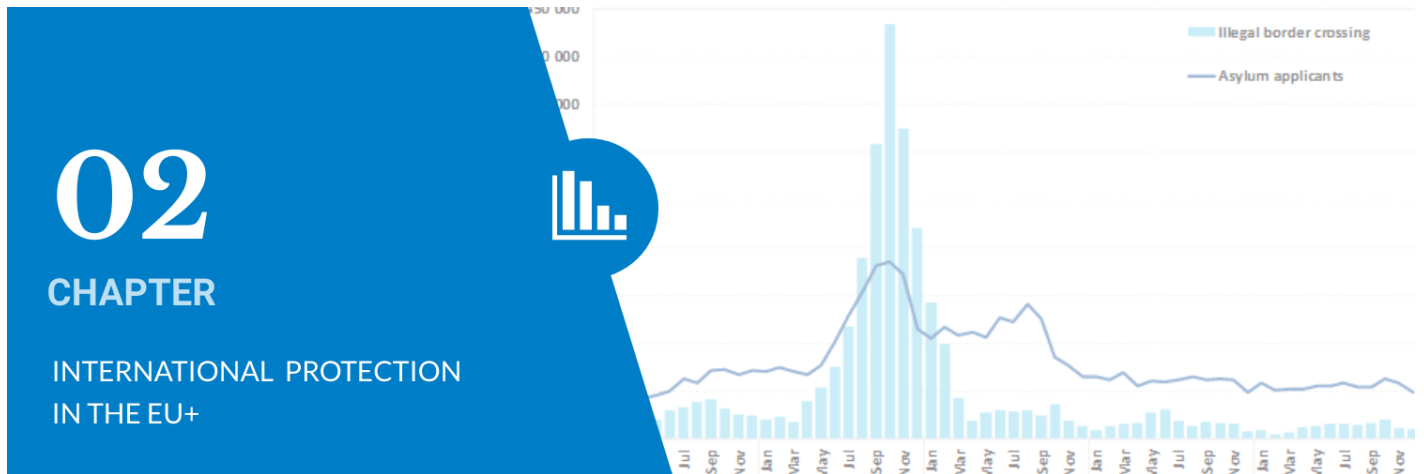

For the functioning of the [Dublin system in 2018](#), a number of developments can be reported on the basis of EASO data, which indicated an overall decrease in the number of decisions in Dublin requests by 5 %.
