Daily expenses

allowance

- **42.1** A clear definition of the scope of daily expenses allowance exists.
- **42.2** The method for the calculation of the daily expenses allowance is clearly determined.
- **42.3** The daily expenses allowance is provided at free disposal ("pocket money").
- 42.4 The amount of daily expenses allowance also reflects as a minimum the following expenses, unless ensured in kind: communication and information, school items, personal hygiene and body care, leisure activities and travelling costs as a result of healthcare visits and obtaining medication, the asylum procedure and legal assistance, and education for children enrolled in school or other education arrangements.
- **42.5** The daily expenses allowance is provided regularly and no less than once a month.
