

## 3.2. Article 15(b) QD: torture or inhuman or degrading treatment or punishment

## Article 15(b) QD

As noted in the chapter <u>Refugee status</u>, some profiles of applicants from Belgravia may be at risk of torture or inhuman or degrading treatment or punishment. In such cases, there would often be a nexus to a reason for persecution falling under the definition of a refugee, and those individuals would qualify for refugee status. However, with reference to cases where there is no nexus to a Convention ground, the need for subsidiary protection under Article 15(b) QD should be examined.
