

Practical Tools for First-Contact Officials

Access to the Asylum Procedure

- 1 Anyone can be a refugee
- 2 Everyone is entitled to protection against refoulement
- 3 Vulnerable persons must be identified and adequately supported
- 4 Best interests of the child take precedence in all actions concerning children
- 5 Anyone who may wish to apply for international protection must be informed about their right to do so
- 6 Everyone has the right to apply for international protection
- 7 Any sign or expression of fear can be understood as a request for international protection
- 8 Applicants for international protection must not be penalised due to their illegal entry or presence
- 9 Each application must be registered or referred for registration to the responsible authority
- 10 The principle of *non-refoulement* must be ensured, even when a person does not apply for asylum

*Emergency healthcare and basic needs should always be addressed first
Every human being shall be valued and respected*

EASO, together with Frontex, has developed a number of new practical tools which aim to assist first-contact officials working at the borders and detention facilities, border and coast guards, police, immigration authorities and personnel of detention facilities, in ensuring access to the asylum procedure for those who may be in need of international protection.
