4.15.2 Coordinated EU approach and increasing role of Frontex

ı		With an expanded mandate through a new regulation issued in December 2019, Frontex is now responsible for
ı		organising voluntary departures of third-country nationals who were issued a return decision by a Member State.
		Frontex can provide technical support to national authorities for voluntary returns on both scheduled and charter
		flights, including the chartering of an aircraft. Therefore, this marked an important change in 2020 in the way
voluntary returns are operationalised at the EU level. In addition, the European Commission adopted the first EU strategy on voluntary return and reintegration in April $2021.\frac{1205}{1205}$		

As a result, several EU+ countries explored new pathways of cooperation with Frontex in the field of return. In fact, Estonia amended its legislation 1206 in order to regulate international cooperation with Frontex. The new cooperation with EU+ countries resulted in a growing number of voluntary returns which were organised or facilitated by Frontex, resulting in nearly one in every five rejected applicants being returned by the end of 2020. The largest operation entailed the return of 107 Georgian nationals from Larnaca to Tbilisi.1207
