

2.5. Other actors

The analysis below is based on the following EUAA COI reports and query: Country Focus 2024, 2.5.; Country Focus 2025, 2.6. (c)(d)(e), 2.7. (c)(d), 2.8.. Country Guidance should not be referred to as a source of COI.

Other than the armed groups mentioned above, a range of other armed actors may also be involved in criminal activities and the actor may not always be identifiable. Often, criminality may involve militias or criminal gangs.

Other non-armed actors of persecution or serious harm may include family members (e.g. in the case of <u>3.9.1.</u> Violence against women and girls, <u>3.9.2.</u> Forced and child marriage, <u>3.9.3.</u> Female genital mutilation or <u>cutting (FGM/C)</u>) and society at large (e.g. in the case of violence towards <u>3.11.</u> Persons with diverse <u>SOGIESC</u>).
