

3.7.2. Refugees, asylum seekers and IDPs

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UNHCR indicated that in 2024, the South-South region, UNHCR and its partners provided support to 37 primary healthcare centres in the delivery of free services to refugees and host communities.^{[1209](#)} In urban areas, UNHCR facilitated free consultations at Primary Health Care facilities for over 900 IDPs and managed over 200 referrals for secondary or tertiary care.^{[1210](#)} The same source indicated that the proportion of asylum seekers and refugees with access to healthcare services in Nigeria in 2024 was 86.76 %.^{[1211](#)}
