



## 2.2.2. Relations with India

During the reporting period, relations between Pakistan and India remained adversarial and security-focused.<sup>148</sup> Formal bilateral dialogue mechanisms remained suspended, and no comprehensive talks were resumed.<sup>149</sup> Both states reiterated long-standing and opposing positions on Kashmir.<sup>150</sup> India maintained that Pakistan facilitated or tolerated cross-border infiltration by militant groups, particularly in the context of attacks in Indian-administered Jammu and Kashmir, while Pakistan rejected these allegations and denied any support for cross-border militancy.<sup>151</sup> The Pakistani government, for its part accused India of supporting Baloch insurgent groups,<sup>152</sup> officially labelling all terrorist groups operating in Balochistan 'Fitna al Hindustan', claiming that this denomination reflected the groups' links to India.<sup>153</sup>

In April 2025, following a fatal armed attack targeting tourists in India-administered Kashmir, India announced a series of diplomatic measures against Pakistan, including the suspension of a key water-sharing treaty, the cessation of bilateral trade and the suspension of most visas<sup>154</sup>, resulting in the deportation of hundreds of Pakistani nationals from India.<sup>155</sup> In response, Pakistan announced reciprocal measures, including the suspension of visas for Indian nationals, the closure of its airspace to Indian flights and a trade ban. The measures were followed by four days of heavy cross-border shelling and aerial operations. These were halted by a ceasefire,<sup>156</sup> which the International Crisis Group assessed in September 2025 as fragile, referring to continued mutual accusations and entrenched mistrust between the parties.<sup>157</sup> Despite the ceasefire, exchanges of small-arms fire between Pakistani and Indian forces were reported during the remainder of the reporting period.<sup>158</sup> Both states also conducted military exercises<sup>159</sup> and missile tests,<sup>160</sup> and accused each other of mismanaging their nuclear weapons.<sup>161</sup> For more information, see section [4.1.2.
