



Recognition of Prior Learning for the course **Becoming an EUAA Trainer and Assessor (BETA v2.0)**

Becoming an EUAA Trainer and Assessor (BETA) is an accredited training course that consists of two parts:

- Becoming an EUAA Trainer (BET) and
- Becoming an EUAA Assessor (BEA).

You need to complete both BET and BEA components, including the corresponding assessments, to obtain the certificate for BETA. Based on your training experience and prior learning, you may be eligible to complete the module BETA through recognition of prior learning (RPL) for the BET component.

This Annex is primarily intended for learners who are eligible to have the BET component of the BETA training recognized through the RPL procedure, for the purpose of obtaining a full certificate for the BETA module; this, in turn, is one of the conditions to be met by officials who would be tasked to deliver EUAA training under different contexts.

1. General entry requirements for BETA:

The general requirements which any learner needs to fulfil to be eligible to follow BETA:

- a) Full qualification at EQF level 5, or equivalent (such as a high school diploma or any diploma that in your member state grants entry into a bachelor's degree programme)
- b) 1 year of experience in the relevant area of expertise in the context of asylum, reception and/or didactics
- c) Proficiency in English

2. Eligibility for the Recognition of Prior Learning (RPL):

The below may be recognized for RPL for BET:

- The EUAA Introduction to Didactics training module
- A previous version of the Becoming an EUAA Trainer (BET)
- A previous version of an EASO (EUAA) train-the-trainer course, which included a Didactics component.

The information contained in this annex may also be applicable for learners who followed a similar training module with another training institution or have experience as a trainer and would like to be exempt from the BET part of the BETA module.

3. RPL Procedure:

- Step 1: Your Training National Contact Point (TNCP) registers you for the specific EUAA session (**'Becoming an EUAA Trainer and Assessor – BEA component only'**) before the deadline. You will then be added by EUAA as a participant in the training.
- Step 2: Since BETA is an accredited module, before you start the training, you will need to fill in your profile or validate/confirm your existing profile.





- Step 3: You will have to download, complete, and re-upload the filled-in [RPL Application form](#) (highlighting Section 1. Recognition of prior formal, informal and non-formal learning)
- Step 4: Upload the applicable supporting evidence, if available, into the designated area in the course page on the LMS.

Applying for RPL does not alter the registration/admissions process and deadlines still apply.

4. Supporting evidence:

Supporting evidence to prove that you meet eligibility requirements listed in Section 2 above should be submitted under your profile on the LMS. In case you have completed the above EUAA/EASO training modules, but cannot retrieve your corresponding certificates, please go through all other steps and EUAA will carry out checks in our database to confirm your eligibility.

5. Possible Outcomes:

EUAA will check your eligibility and, provided the RPL is granted in line with the EUAA RPL policy¹, you will have access to the BEA component of the training. If you pass the BEA assessment at the end of the training, you will receive the full BETA accredited certificate.

6. Appeals:

The decision regarding the RPL is final and there is no provision for an appeals process.
