

Note on the interpretation of the *Internal Guidance on Lecturers and Trainers IG-015-02*

Further to the [*Internal Guidance on Lecturers and Trainers*](#) (hereafter referred to as IG-015-02, or *Internal Guidance*), this document provides an internal guidance note on the implementation of the requirements to be met by individuals for inclusion in the EUAA Training Pool and their subsequent engagement as trainers, in accordance with Section 3.1 of the IG.

EUAA trainers play a central role in strengthening Member States' capacity to implement the Common European Asylum System (CEAS), as emphasized in both the [*Training Quality Assurance Framework*](#) and the [*Training and Learning Strategy*](#).

In accordance with the [*EUAA Regulation*](#) and the [*Decision of the Executive Director no. 16/2024 on the Terms of Reference for Experts in the EUAA Training Pool*](#), the Agency maintains a pool of qualified experts who contribute to the design, development, and delivery of EUAA training activities, and also serve as assessors and verifiers.

Internal Guidance IG-015-02 provides the overarching framework for ensuring the competence, selection, performance monitoring, and professional development of EUAA trainers. As set out in the Internal Guidance, trainers delivering EAC training modules or future EUAA study programmes may be classified under one of the eight categories listed in Section 3.

Regarding the criteria for the selection and deployment of trainers for the delivery of EUAA training, and with a view to ensuring consistent quality of training implementation, the IG is understood to apply to all **accredited sessions**, regardless of the framework in which such sessions are organised. At the same time, the conditions set in the IG and their interpretation as per this document should equally guide the selection of trainers nominated for the delivery of non-accredited training sessions in EAC modules.

Implementation of the existing requirements:

According to *Internal Guidance 015-02*, trainers are required to fulfil the following requirements:

A. Requirements (to be met alternatively) linked to didactical knowledge/experience:

- a.1. The completion of the module Becoming an EUAA Trainer and Assessor (BETA); or
- a.2. A recognised EU-accredited qualification/award in training/teaching (EQF/MQF level 4 or above); or
- a.3. Prior experience in teaching/delivering training.

and

B. Requirements (to be met alternatively) linked to content knowledge/expertise in the specific thematic area:

- b.1. The completion of an EAC content-related module (and assessment if available); or
- b.2. Prior experience in an area relevant to the module to be delivered

For the purpose of selection and deployment of trainers to deliver EUAA training, these requirements will be interpreted and verified as follows:
