The aim of this module is to provide learners with basic knowledge on Country of Origin Information (COI), its relevance and limitations in the context of international protection, including focusing on quality standards applied in the COI research cycle.

This module focuses on the categories and formulation of appropriate COI questions, as well as, on the examination of the most frequently used COI Sources and source assessment.
